


BAUS Data & Audit Programme Update January 2025

Nephrostomy & I-DUNC Audits - Results

ELLA Audit – Now Closed for Analysis

A big thank you to all units who completed the one-off unit survey about the bladder service configuration in their hospital and submitted data on

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consecutive patients who underwent TURBT during the audit period. We received almost 100 completed surveys and data on over 1400 patients from approximately 100 units. The preliminary results will be presented at BAUS 2025 in Manchester. Penile Fracture (SNAP) Audit – Now open

This audit will collect data on all patients undergoing surgical repair for penile fracture between 1 April 2022 and 31 March 2024. Data submission will take place from 1 March to 31 March 2025 inclusive. Further information on this audit can be found here

EMPAST Audit – Coming in Spring 2025

The Evaluating the Management Pathway for Suspected Testicular Cancer (EMPAST) audit will evaluate the adherence to and efficacy of the established testicular cancer pathway in managing suspected cases across urology units across the United Kingdom. It will also assess the management of non-cancer patients initially referred to the cancer pathway. The quality of performance will be measured and reported against a set of nationally agreed standards (the Testicular Cancer Quality Performance Indicators) as well as the 21-day Faster Diagnosis Standards (FDS). Data will be collected retrospectively over a three-month period (to be confirmed) and data submission will take place before BAUS 2025.


BOOMERANG Audit - Coming in Autumn 2025

The British audit Of the investigatiOn and referral of woMen with recurrent uRinary trAct infection using recent Guidance (BOOMERANG) will assess the management of women with rUTI as they are referred from primary care to Urology. It will assess adherence to recent guidance from the Academy of the joint Royal Medical Colleges (AORMC) as well as the updated NICE guidance (NG112) by capturing patients seen in clinic over a 2-week period.

Data Projects

BOO Outcomes Project

The ASG is committed to using existing datasets/big data to help shape future BAUS snapshot audits and research projects, thereby ensuring that this data is fully utilised in a focused and relevant way. The BOO Outcomes Project is a collaborative undertaking with NCIP and HIN (Health Innovation Network), led by the ASG. The ASG will analyse pseudonymised patient data on BOO procedures



extracted from the NCIP data portal to address the question 'How the reoperation and readmission rates for bladder outflow obstruction (BOO) surgery vary by index procedure?' The analysis will investigate whether the data can reveal factors contributing to these rates and evaluate the impact of innovative procedures on patient outcomes. The results may be used to support evidence-based recommendations, quality improvement initiatives, and refinement of best practice.
